Brother Bruce Bremer



A Milwaukee native, Bruce, was in the Armed forces and received an honorable discharge from the Air force in 1970. For over 36 years he worked with the Los Angeles Department of Health Services, his professional work

prompted him to be the Pro-Life advocate for our council. Brother Bruce was raised by his mother and grandmother in Maywood, California. Bruce credits St. Rose of Lima as his patroness, having attended a parochial school and been baptized in a church both of which carry her name.
