1 New Knight + 1 Experienced Knight = A Great Knight

There's a simple equation for making a new Knight into a great Knight—just add one experienced each group in order to pair proscouncil member to act as his mentor.

Look at your council's membership and determine which members would make the best mentors. These should be men who are passionate and knowledgeable about the Order, have outgoing personalities, and are willing to commit the necessary time to be a mentor. In many cases, the new Knight's proposer can also act as his mentor.

Ask each of your mentors to fill

out a Member Interest Survey as well. Then compare surveys from pects with mentor Knights who are the most compatible.

The mentor should be given all the pertinent information on the prospect (name, address, wife's name, etc. phone number, e-mail address and a copy of the Member Interest Survey). He should then attend the candidate's First Degree, introduce himself and plan on staying throughout the event. He should also introduce the new Knight to the council's insurance representative. After the First

Degree, the mentor should let the new Knight know when the next council meeting will be and offer to bring him to the first meeting and introduce him to the other council members.

The mentor should also confirm that the new Knight is added to the council's e-mail list and pone tree and that he is set to receive the council newsletter.

Using the information from the new Knight's Member Interest Survey, the mentor should introduce him to the chairs of activities he might be interested in.

How to prevent losing your life insurance at just the wrong time

When you buy term life insurance, your premium pays for the policy's "face value," or the dollar amount that will be paid if you die within the policy's term (typically 10, 15, or 20 years). If you live beyond that term, the policy either expires or becomes prohibitively expensive, leaving you and your family without any coverage.

If you want to buy another term policy at that point, you'll need to be in good enough health to qualify, and in most cases, you'll need to be age 65 or younger.

Two common retirement planning mistakes

In choosing a term length, ask yourself, "When do I want this coverage to go away?" If the answer is, "After the kids are on their own and I've retired," consider two serious, but all-too-typical, scenarios:

- Income gap for surviving spouse: If you or your spouse live many years beyond retirement—as more and more of us are—your retirement investments may or may not provide adequate income for the surviving spouse's final years.
- ② Excess tax liability on your estate: Proceeds from life insurance generally pass directly to beneficiaries, without going through the probate process. If you're successful and fortunate enough to leave behind a generous financial legacy, the last thing you want is for taxes and fees to siphon a significant amount of it before it reaches your heirs or designated charities.

Convert to life insurance you can't outlive

If your answer to, "When do I want this coverage to go away?" is "Never," term life insurance probably isn't the right product. While many companies offer term plans with limited or no guaranteed conversion privileges, most of our policies are guaranteed to be convertible into permanent ("whole") life insurance with no

If you purchased Knights of Columbus term life insurance within the last three or four years, you may be eligible to have one year of premiums paid credited toward a permanent life insurance policy. Lock in your rate now for insurance that builds cash value and doesn't expire for as long as you live.

medical review. Permanent insurance pays your beneficiaries when you die, no matter how long you live.

If possible, don't wait until retirement age to convert term to permanent insurance. The rate you pay for a permanent policy is based on your age on the date of conversion—so the earlier the better.

Another advantage: Permanent polices offered by the Knights of Columbus are eligible for dividends that further boost the cash value. Although dividends aren't guaranteed, historically they've generated significant value over long periods.

If you're not sure whether you have term or permanent insurance, or whether you're eligible to convert term coverage to permanent insurance, let me help you review your coverage and your goals for retirement.
